Abstract:

As the society is becoming more complex and dependent on science and technology, the need for timely organization, communication and dissemination of information is increasing. Information is the key element that marks the difference between the highly developed and the developing societies in the world. Application of information technology is essential for information management. Application of IT in college library implies automating their services and to extend to their areas of services. Modernization in that content entails the process by which a library is functionally suitable for use in new or extended domain. This is the way in which a library is made to cope up with new situations. In this context this paper trying to find out the present status of automation in the light of the problem and prospect of the college library in Barpeta District, Assam.

1.Introduction:

Library automation is general term which usually used to refer to the application of computers and Information Communication Technology (ICT) to replace the manual system to perform the traditional activities such as acquisition, cataloguing, circulation, serial control, and administration in the library. Many activities of a library are routine in nature, a few are repetitive. Automation of these activities helps in managing the library's resources in a better way at the same time saving time, and manpower. An automated library is a library where the collection of reading materials are primarily on papers (printed) but in which the library procedures have been computerization. Computerization of the library procedures increases the efficiency of different housekeeping operation.

- 2. To find out the problems of automation in the college libraries of Barpeta district.
- 3. To find out how many college libraries of Barpeta district have undertaken automation.
- 4. To examine the IT infrastructural facilities available in college libraries of Barpeta District.
- 5. To study college libraries of Barpeta district in various aspects.

1.5 METHODOLOGY OF THE STUDY

A comprehension survey of the selected libraries has been undertaken with the help of a structured questionnaire designed for the librarian with an intension to assess the status, problems of automation of college libraries in Barpeta District. The opinions of the college librarians on various issues of automation have been collected through interviews. I have also made observation in different libraries by paying physical visit to them..

1.4 SCOPE OF THE STUDY


The Govt. of Assam through an act, 'The Assam College Employees (Provincialization) Act, 2005 provincialized the general degree colleges in Assam. Before provincialization, these colleges were run under deficit-grants –in – aid system. At present, there are around 208 colleges, 9 colleges are in Bodo Territorial Administered District (BTAD) areas and 3 colleges are pure Govt. colleges. These colleges are spread over 27 districts of Assam (4 districts in BTAD areas). At present there are 29 colleges of Barpeta district, (which are some provincialized, Government and Non – Provincialized) some of them are Govts, Provincialized and Non-Provincialized.

In my study all the colleges of Barpeta district is selected. Therefore the sample of the study is small which comprises of 218 colleges and bibliographies are written in API style.

4.2 COLLEGES OF BARPETA DISTRICT

At present Barpeta district have a total number of 24 colleges including Government, private, provincialized, non-provincialized. I have found all the colleges. Besides there are a good number of junior colleges. In Barpeta district there are two B.Ed colleges and only one Law College. Most ancient college is M.C college, established 1939. The colleges under study are shown in table 1. Which are arranged according to their year of establishment

4.4 LIBRARY COLLECTION

Collection of any type of library reflects the types of services offered by the library to its reader. A balance of collection selected on a judicious basis is a must to offer the appropriate service by the library. The college libraries of Barpeta district do not have a rich collection because the budgetary condition of the college is not at all satisfactory one for the

library professionals. The main source of income is fees collected from the student where little amount of money is used for fulfillment of demand of the users. UGC grant and state govt. for library is not in regular basis and the grant which we get from different sources authority expand it for other works of the colleges. So, it is not possible for the library to procure sufficient number of reference books and current journals for the users

4.6 SOURCES OF FUND

It is essential for effective functioning. In spite of variation in nature, type and locality of libraries. Libraries have following source of income like government grant, library fees, gift, fine and other sources. College library of Barpeta district is not able to provide automation services due to lack of funds from government, lack of sufficient support from college authority and lack of trained professionals, lack of skilled manpower, lack of ICT infrastructure in the library, library staff are not familiar with the latest ICT applications.






Fig.3 showing the use of library software in pie diagram.

The status of Automation of college libraries of Barpeta district is showing in the table 12. Under my survey colleges, there are five college libraries introduce automation partly. The table reveals that M.C college library have 30,000 (59.30%) number of records in database out of total 50,592 collections. M.C college have highest database out of five automation college libraries. Bhawanipur Anchalik college have minimum number of database 2050 (11.39%) out of total 18,000 collections. In table -12 is showing that only five college libraries introduce and rest of college libraries have not yet introduce library automation. Under my study Bhawanipur Anchalik college, is the initial stage of library Automation, and others 18 colleges has not yet started library automation.




Fig (4) percentage of library holdings converted into machine readable form.

5.3 CONCLUSION

New developments in ICTs have brought great opportunities for libraries of present day. The use of ICT enables them to fulfill their mission of providing the user community with relevant, timely and up-to-date information. Academic libraries should take advantage of these developments and adequately train their staff so that they can cope with new technologies. The college libraries unavailability of sufficient ICT infrastructure is due to lack of initiatives from the library authority. College libraries failure to complete the retrospective conversion of the library holdings in to machine readable form tremendously affects the automation programme and also in introducing ICT enabled services in the libraries. Insufficient strength of staff with lack of professional and ICT skills, together with lack of management experience, training, and commitment all these factors are found to be responsible for un-satisfactory progress of automation works in most of the college in Assam. The college libraries of Assam are suffering from the problems like lack of policy objectives, effective planning and management strategies. These problems are to be resolved. The college administration should address these problems more seriously so that college library can play leading role in the teaching, learning and research activities in this digital era.

In spite of these problems, the automation activities of college libraries of Assam are slowly gaining momentum throughout the state. It is very encouraging that college libraries of Assam are getting library management software SOUL free of cost from UGC through INFLIBNET centre, Ahmedabad under Prime Ministers special scheme for the North – East. This encourages many college libraries of Barpeta district to initiate the process of automation and as a result automation activities of college libraries in Assam have further speed up to a certain extent. Though automation activities are undertaken at the same time the college librarians of Assam should prepare themselves to meet the challenges of the digital revolution. They should learn the skill and expertise in ICT applications in the libraries. The library staff should also be trained properly so as to become familiar with the ICT applications. The study concludes that the college libraries of Barpeta should develop ICT infrastructure extensively so as to make the use of the library resources optimally, both conventional and digital resources.
